PAIUTE PALACE CASINO TORT LIABILITY ORDINANCE

No. 2000-01

Section 1 Purpose:

The Bishop Paiute Tribe (Tribe) is a party to a Class III Gaming Compact with the State of California. Section 10.2(d) requires that the Tribe adopt a tort liability ordinance that would provide the potential for insurance coverage for patrons suffering property damage or personal injury while at the Gaming Facility.

Section 2 Limit of Liability:

To the extent that there is available based on the tort concept of negligence (fault) applicable liability insurance coverage, Tribe waives its immunity from suit as to patrons injured or who suffer property damage while at the Paiute Palace Casino. This waiver is expressly limited to the exact words of the waiver. That is:

- (a) The claimant must be a patron at the time of injury/property damage.
- (b) California Rules of Negligent Tort Liability are to apply (recovery based on fault).
- (c) There must be liability insurance in effect covering any such claim, and the amount of any such settlement or judgment must be within policy limits available to Tribe.
- (d) Injury/property damage at the Tribal gas station are not covered by this ordinance.

NOTICE

Any patron who has suffered personal injury or property damage while at the Casino Gaming Facility and feels that the injury or property damage was the fault of the Casino may file a claim as follows:

- (1) Obtain an accident report from Casino security.
- (2) Fill out the accident report form and return to Casino security.

Your claim will be reviewed and you will be contacted by Casino staff or a Casino representative.



Section 3 Claim Procedures:


The Paiute Palace Casino shall adopt and post procedures for accepting and processing claims for personal injury and property damage. Such procedures shall be posted in a place available to Paiute Palace Patrons.
