Cleaner Air



Motor vehicles are a leading source of air pollutants that affect human health. Vehicle emissions contribute to the formation of ground level ozone (smog), which can trigger health problems such as aggravated asthma, reduced lung capacity, and increased susceptibility to respiratory illnesses, including pneumonia and bronchitis. Motor vehicles, particularly those used for freight, are also a major source of fine particulate matter.

Many scientific studies have linked breathing particulate matter to significant health problems, including asthma, chronic bronchitis, and heart attacks. Diesel particulate matter is of particular concern because long-term exposure is likely to cause lung cancer. Levels of traffic-related air pollution are higher near major roadways that have high traffic volume.

TREES AND POWER LINES

Trees near power lines are dangerous! When a tree grows close to a power line, it can create shock hazards, power outages, and fires:



If you climb a tree near a power line and touch the power line, electricity will go through you and you can be hurt or killed.

If a tree branch falls on a power line, it can cause a power outage. Electricity can go off in any homes or businesses served by the power line until the electric utility can remove the branch and fix the line. If a tree branch touches a high-voltage power line, electricity from the line can make the branch so hot it catches fire. From there, the fire can spread to nearby trees, plants, or buildings.

Metallic balloons that come in contact with power lines can cause power outages. Keep them far away and never release them outdoors. If you see a metallic balloon near a power line or stuck in a tree; please report it to SCE by calling: 1-800-611-1911

IHS Food Handler Training

The Indian Health Service, Division of Environmental Health Services has developed the Online Food Handler Training to meet the training needs of those people who, because of time constraints, geographic location, or other reasons, prefer to receive food sanitation training in the convenience of an online course. A Food Handler Certificate from the Indian Health Service (IHS) certifies that you have taken the training and passed the quiz. It is not a permit to sell food. Food Handler Certificates may be honored by Tribes or possibly non-Tribal entities. Go to IHS.gov Type in food handler training on the IHS site and follow the information needed to begin the food handler course.
